

# CEFR Level

CEFR is an acronym that stand for Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

CEFR levels are a method for describing language ability.

The following table describes the CEFR levels:

<b>C2</b>	<b>Proficiency</b> C1 skills Can easily understand almost everything they see and hear Can express themselves fluently and spontaneously with precision in complex situations
<b>C1</b>	<b>Advanced</b> B2 Skills Can understand wide range of long, complex texts Can interact and express themselves fluently and spontaneously Can use language effectively in social, academic, and professional situations
<b>B2</b>	<b>Upper Intermediate</b> B1 skills Can understand main ideas of complex text Can interact with some fluency and communicate easily Can write clear, detailed text on wide range of topics and express their opinion
<b>B1</b>	<b>Intermediate</b> A2 skills Can understand familiar topics Can communicate while traveling in an English-speaking area Can write simple text on familiar topics
<b>A2</b>	<b>Pre-Intermediate</b> A1 skills Interact in simple and direct changes of information Describe things around them Describe things they need
<b>A1</b>	<b>Elementary</b> Communicate using everyday expressions and very basic phrases Can introduce themselves Ask and answer simple questions about personal details

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
